

## Online Dual Enrollment FAQ

### What is Online Dual Enrollment?

Online Dual Enrollment is where high school students enroll in online college courses and receive both high school and college credit.

### Who is eligible?

Juniors and Seniors with a GPA of 3.0 are eligible to participate. Some colleges have higher requirements.

### Who teaches the course?

The student is enrolled in the college or university and takes the course from the college or university professor?

### How much does it cost?

The student is responsible for 100% of the cost including the cost of textbooks. The cost from each college varies. Below is a chart showing the cost of some colleges. Some colleges offer a discount to students who are dually enrolled and some do not. Financial aid is not available.

## What are the requirements for the colleges?

Each college has their own requirements. I would encourage you to contact the college before applying. Some colleges have requirements for specific courses and some have requirements to enter the program. Below are the requirements to enter the program for some colleges.

Each college has their own enrollment procedures. Most will require a form to be filled out by the high school counselor.

**What if I can't get into my college course?**

Students will enroll for all 7 hours of high school courses. Once a student has confirmation that they have been enrolled in the college or university they will drop 1 high school course. If the college course is full, then they will take the high school course.

**Does the student have to attend high school?**

Technically, no the student is not required to attend high school during this period of the day. Depending the schedule of the student the only time available to take the online course might be during the middle of the day. If enrollment is high enough during that hour the district might have a teacher available to help students. The district can not guarantee this will be available to all students.

**How does a student earn high school credit?**

Once the student completes the course, they will turn in their college transcript at the end of the semester and the district will issue the appropriate high school credit at that time.

**Are these courses weighted?**

No, these courses are not weighted.

**Who do I pay?**

All payments go directly to the college.

**Can a student take courses from an out of state universities?**

Yes.

**Will chromebooks meet the technical specifications?**

It will depend on the university, but chromebooks should work for most schools.

**What is the 42-hour block?**

Some missouri institutions have a block of general education credit for transfer; some institutions require credits above the 42-hour minimum. Below is a link to a list of participating universities and more information in the 42-hour block.
