Dear Parent or Guardian:

In preparation for the 2017-2018 school year we would like to inform you of the immunization requirements in the state of Missouri. State law and health regulations require students to be properly immunized and provide verification to attend school, unless they are exempt.

- Students entering 8th grade must have a Tdap vaccine (Tetnus Booster) and MCV (meningococcal vaccine)
- Students who are entering 12th grade must have two doses of MCV (Meningococcal vaccine). Unless, the first dose was administered after the students 16th birthday, then only one dose is required.

Your child’s medical provider can provide more information concerning vaccines and requirements. We also wanted to make you aware that immunizations can be completed at our Wentzville School District back-to-school clinics as well as at the St Charles County Department of Health Clinic.

Please provide proof of immunizations by August 1, 2017 to your student’s school nurse. This will allow ample time for the nurses to update immunization records. **Students who do not have immunization proof prior to the first day of school will not be allowed to start the new school year until proof of vaccination is received.**
